The Wilmington AM Rotary Club and the Clinton County Homeless Shelter (CCHS) would like to invite you to participate in **CARDBOARD CITY 2017!** The event will be held on Saturday, September 16th at 6:00 p.m. to Sunday, September 17th at 5:00 a.m. at the Clinton County Courthouse parking lot.

CARDBOARD CITY is the largest fundraising event of the year for the Clinton County Homeless Shelter, and the Wilmington AM Rotary Club is proud to have sponsored this event for the past 19 years. Participants will be building houses from cardboard and then sleeping in them for a night to gain perspective on what it may feel like to be homeless. They will also participate in a community exchange of ideas, goals, and facts.

If you are not up to spending the night in a cardboard box; you, your family, your business, church, club or organization can still participate in this wonderful event:

- Donate to **CARDBOARD CITY** to support the shelter in the important and necessary services to less fortunate individuals and families of Clinton County. Checks should be made payable to Clinton County Homeless Shelter and mailed to Cardboard City 2017, 253 Linkhart Road, Wilmington, OH 45177.
- Join us at 7:00 p.m. at CARDBOARD CITY for our “**Hands Together for Homelessness**” event. This is our third year for this event, and our wish is to form a human chain around the entire block of the Clinton County Courthouse to raise the awareness of homelessness in the area and the work being done by the CCHS. We were pretty short of people making it last year for several different reasons, and we need you to participate so we can make it this year!

The CCHS provides emergency shelter, compassionate care and support to the homeless and underprivileged in Clinton County; while remembering that each resident is a person of worth. Each night, they can house up to 38 men, women and children. In 2016, the Shelter was home for 191 individuals including 33 children. They called the shelter home for 7,992 nights and were served 39,960 meals/snacks. They also offer a 24-hour food pantry for those in need which served over 397 households in the community last year. In addition to providing shelter, CCHS offers counseling and resources to the families they serve to help them regain their independence and dignity. They not only assist them in finding affordable housing, but also help them acquire the tools needed to turn their lives around.

Our objective is to raise funds to keep the shelter open through the generosity of the Clinton County community leaders, individuals, businesses, churches, youth, and civic organizations. We are sure you agree that the shelter provides important and necessary services to less fortunate individuals and families of Clinton County.
